2026 Florida Little League 8–10 Year Old State Tournament General Information

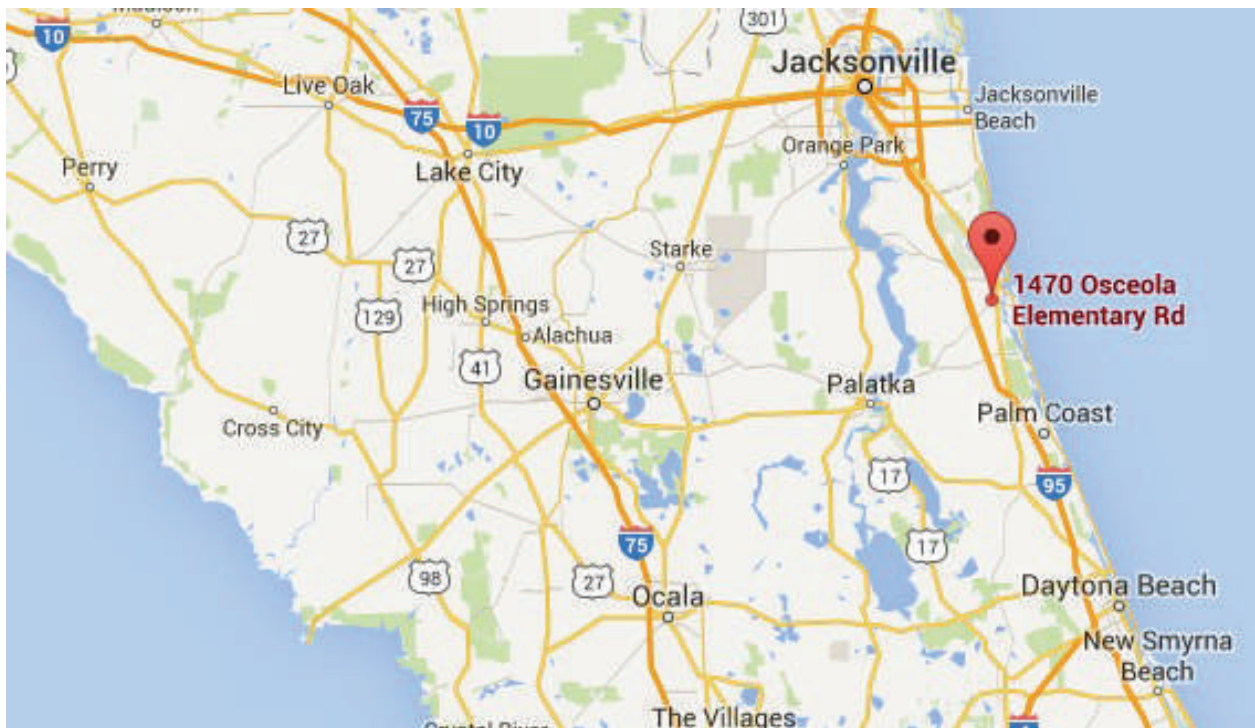
1. **Welcome and congratulations!** We are excited to welcome you to the Ancient City and look forward to hosting you during the tournament.
2. A **MANDATORY Team Managers Meeting** will be held on **Friday, July 17, 2026, at 12:00 PM** in the meeting room above the concession stand (2nd floor) at St. Augustine Little League.
3. During the Managers Meeting, the tournament format, schedule, and rules will be reviewed. Copies of any local ground rules will be provided. This is the appropriate time to ask any questions regarding tournament operations. Managers are encouraged to inspect the playing fields prior to competition. Teams arriving on Thursday evening may have access to practice field space, if available.
4. The following documents will be reviewed at the Managers Meeting or prior to your team's first game: Team Affidavit Supporting Eligibility Documentation, CDC Certificate, and Medical Release form.
5. All games will be conducted in accordance with the **2026 Little League Tournament Rules and Guidelines**. Managers and coaches are responsible for knowing all applicable rules and procedures, including protest procedures.
6. Obscene language, unsportsmanlike conduct, or harassment by any player, coach, parent, or spectator will not be tolerated. Offenders will be removed from the complex. Noise makers, air horns, boom boxes, and personal walk-up music systems are prohibited. All game announcements will be made by the St. Augustine Little League public address announcer.
7. Teams should arrive at the complex **at least one (1) hour prior** to their scheduled game time.
8. Designated team warm-up areas will be discussed during the Managers Meeting.
9. Each team is responsible for cleaning its dugout and removing all trash before vacating the area following a game.
10. **No outside coolers** are permitted inside the complex. The only exception is a team cooler located in the dugout containing water, sports drinks, wet towels, and similar team necessities. If there are medical or infant-care needs requiring a cooler, please notify a tournament staff member. We appreciate your support of the host league's concession operations.
11. The use of tobacco products, vaping devices, and alcohol is strictly prohibited within the complex. Smoking is permitted **only in designated parking lot areas**. No exceptions.
12. Managers and coaches are responsible for communicating tournament policies and expectations to their players, parents, and fans. This includes, but is not limited to, cooler restrictions, tournament format, schedules, rules, and procedures.

Thank you for your cooperation, and best of luck to all teams participating in the **2026 Florida Little League 8–10 Year Old State Tournament** hosted by **St. Augustine Little League**. We wish everyone a safe, enjoyable, and memorable tournament experience.

Heat illness can be prevented!

Protecting Players from the Effects of Heat

At times, players may be required to play in hot environments for long periods. When the human body's unable to maintain a normal temperature, heat-related illnesses can occur and may result in death. The following article provides information on the how to prevent players illnesses and death caused by heat stress.

Factors that May Cause Heat-related Illness

- High temperature and humidity
- Low fluid consumption
- Direct sun exposure (with no shade) or extreme heat
- Limited air movement (no breeze or wind)
- Physical exertion
- Use of bulky protective clothing and equipment
- Poor physical condition or ongoing health problems
- Some medications
- Pregnancy
- Lack of previous exposure to hot workplaces
- Previous heat-related illness



Health Problems Caused by Hot Environments

Heat Stroke is the most serious heat-related health problem. Heat stroke occurs when the body's temperature regulating system fails and body temperature rises to critical levels (greater than 104°F). ***This is a medical emergency that may result in death!*** The signs of heat stroke are confusion, loss of consciousness and seizures. Players experiencing heat stroke have a very high body temperature and may stop sweating. If a player shows signs of possible heat stroke, ***get medical help immediately***, and call 911. Until medical help arrives, move the player to a shady, cool area and remove as much clothing as possible. Wet the player with cool water and circulate the air to speed cooling. Place cold wet cloths, wet towels or ice all over the body or soak the player's clothing with cold water.

Heat Exhaustion is the next most serious heat-related health problem. The signs and symptoms of heat exhaustion are headache, nausea, dizziness, weakness, irritability, confusion, thirst, heavy sweating and a body temperature greater than 100.4°F. Players with heat exhaustion should be removed from the hot area and given liquids to drink. Remove unnecessary clothing including shoes and socks. Cool the player with cold compresses to the head, neck, and face or have the player wash his or her head, face and neck with cold water. Encourage frequent sips of cool water. Players with signs or symptoms of heat exhaustion should be taken to a clinic or emergency room for medical evaluation and treatment. Make sure that someone stays with the player until help arrives. If symptoms worsen, call 911 and get help immediately.

Heat Cramps are muscle pains usually caused by physical exertion in a hot play environment. Heat cramps are caused by the loss of body salts and fluid during sweating. Players with heat cramps should replace fluid loss by drinking water and/or carbohydrate-electrolyte replacement liquids (e.g., sports drinks) every 15 to 20 minutes.
